## Ashley Akins

Ashley Akins has been awarded a Community
Research Fellowship. With this fellowship, Ashley
plans to research how community-based enterprises
and networks can assist in the preservation and
revitalization of both traditional ecological knowledge
(TEK) and the social economy in impoverished
indigenous communities. Ashley is a 2009 graduate
of UVic, majoring in environmental studies and Latin
American studies. She was remarkably active as an
undergraduate, becoming the founder and president
of the Q'ente Textile Revitalization Society as well as

the co-founder and director of *Mosqoy*: Sacred Valley Youth Fund, two sustainability projects based in the Andes region of Peru that have earned Ashley a number of awards and scholarships. *Q'ente* is a community network that provides a fair outlet through which to sell textiles while promoting traditional art and culture. *Mosqoy* provides post-secondary educational opportunities to impoverished youth of the Sacred Valley.
